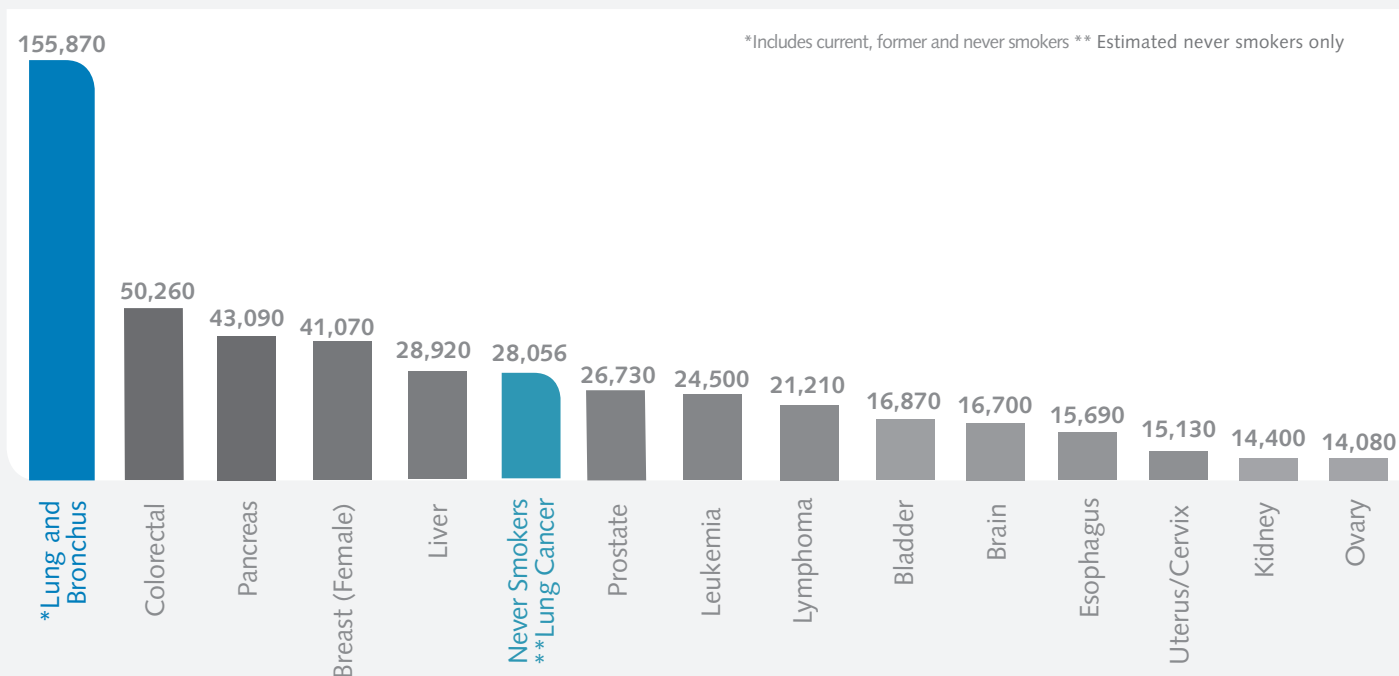

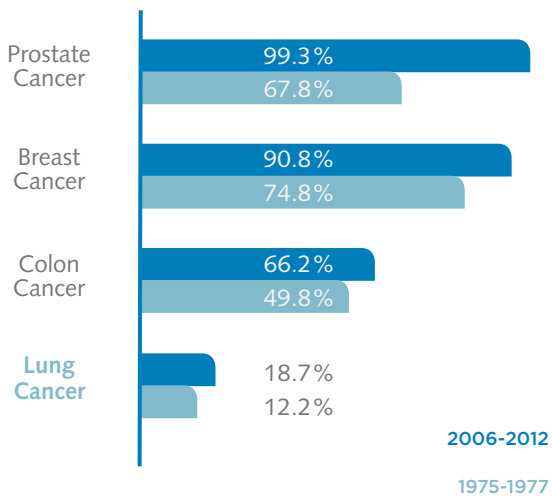

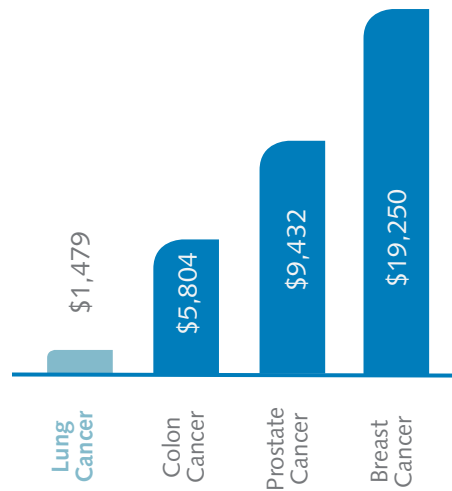

LUNG CANCER MORTALITY REDUCTION MUST BECOME A PUBLIC HEALTH PRIORITY. WHY?

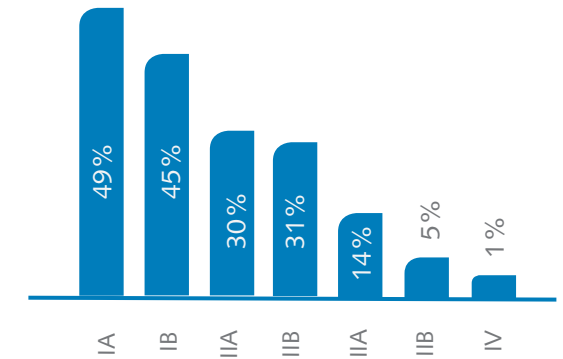
